

Every year we celebrate WORLD MISSION SUNDAY; this year it falls on October 21/22. Especially that weekend, we recommit ourselves to giving generously to our brothers and sisters around the world through the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith.

Behold the Lamb of God, 60 Questions and Answers on The Mystery of the Eucharist By Edward Sri

Why is the Eucharist so important?

Love wants to be near the one it loves. That is why the God who is love (see 1 John 4:8) chose to remain so intimately close to us and even unite himself to us in this most unique gift of his very Body and Blood in the Eucharist.

As you will discover in this book, the Eucharist is the most beautiful gift of his very self. It is called the "source and summit of the Christian life" because all we are and all we do as Christians flow from the Eucharist and lead us toward it. As the Catechism of the Catholic Church explains, the Eucharist is called the "Holy and Divine Liturgy" because all the Church's worship finds its most intense expression in the Eucharistic celebration (CCC 1330). It is called the "Holy Sacrifice" because it makes present Christ's loving sacrifice on the Cross and unites our lives with that love (CCC 1330). It is called the "medicine of immortality" because in Holy Communion we receive healing from our sins and a foretaste of our heavenly home. It is also the "sacrament of love," as Jesus remains mysteriously present to us in the tabernacles in our churches, waiting for us to spend time with him in prayer and adoration.
