

# THE EUCHARIST AS HOLY SACRIFICE



Is this just about remembering Jesus' sacrificial death?

No. It's so much more. The sacrificial gift of himself that Jesus offered on the Cross for our salvation some two thousand years ago is made present to us today at the celebration of the Eucharist. The Eucharist doesn't just recall Christ's death on the Cross. It actually makes that saving event present to us so that we can enter into it. When we go to mass, we in a very real sense go to Calvary, for the mystery of the Cross is made present to us sacramentally. The sacrifice on the Cross and the Eucharist sacrifice are the same sacrifice.

# Advent Season 2023

Advent is a season of waiting and expectation for Christmas – the birth of Christ, the Nativity of Our Lord. We prepare our homes and hearts for four weeks before Christmas. Advent is also the beginning of a new liturgical season – it concludes a long period of Ordinary Time and leads us into the new church year with hope and patience in preparation for Christmas.

In Advent, we prepare for His birth. The birth and resurrection of Christ are intertwined, and their connection is quite significant theologically. Yet, these seasons of waiting look different for us - Advent is a uniquely joyous and hopeful season in the Church.

We light candles amidst the darkness. We find warmth in the cold, dark winter season. And we come together as friends and family to celebrate the coming of our Savior.

Advent always starts four Sundays before Christmas. This year, in 2023, Advent starts Sunday, December 3. The four candles of Advent represent the four Sundays of Advent, and they respectively symbolize hope, peace, joy, and love.

- · First week of Advent December 3rd – Hope: Prophecy Candle (purple)
- Second week of Advent December 10th Peace: Bethlehem Candle (purple)
- December 17th Joy: Shepherd's Candle (pink) Gaudate Sunday December 24th Love: Angel's Candle (purple) Third week of Advent
- · Fourth week of Advent





#### 1. Ask God to help you draw near to Him. The more we yearn for Christ in Advent, the closer we come to a real celebration of Christmas. 2. Begin to practice silence.

- 3. Gather your essential Advent items
- 4. Don't sweat the small stuff.
- 5. Prepare for a good confession now.
