60 Questions and Answers On the Mystery of the Eucharist



THE EUCHARIST AS HOLY SACRIFICE



How can Jesus' bloody sacrifice be present in the Eucharist in an unbloody way? Does Jesus ever teach about the Eucharist being a sacrifice?

Jesus instituted the Eucharist in the context of the great Jewish Feast of Passover, during which a lamb would be offered in sacrifice. At the Last Supper, He spoke about his Body and Blood in ways that would recall the sacrifice of the lambs for the Passover feast. He spoke of his Body being "given for" and his blood being "poured out" (Luke 22:19-20). In the first century Jewish world, this language would have strong sacrificial overtones. It recalls the ancient Jewish sacrificial rites of the Temple, in which an animal's body was "offered up" and it's blood was "poured out" in sacrifice.

By taking the sacrificial language from the Temple and applying it to his own Body and Blood, Jesus was already anticipating his sacrifice on the Cross. He was referring to his Body and Blood as being offered in sacrifice like that of a Passover Lamb.
