A Message from Fr. Pat....

We have now moved back into our beautiful church; we are so thankful of the great job that was done, and that our church building is watertight and structurally secure for a long time to come. We are still having some work being done on the sound system to connect the speakers in the ceiling, so until that is done, the sound in the church maybe a little substandard.

This past Sunday we sent three individuals to the Cathedral for the rite of enrollment by Bishop Bill into the process of becoming a Catholic at the Easter Vigil Mass, and they are now called the "Elect"; these individuals are.

Between now and Holy Week, they will be going through what is called the period of purification and enlightenment; during this period there will be three scrutinies.

What are the Scrutinies?

On the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent, the newly named "Elect" participate in three successive rites called "the Scrutinies." These rites, with roots dating back to the early Church, take place during the Sunday Mass, each thematically linked to the Gospel reading for that Mass. The three passages from St. John's Gospel for these Sundays were selected around 500 AD powerful depictions of the hidden as transformation God accomplishes in the Elect through each Scrutiny. Each proclamation emphasizes repentance and conversion as the Light of Christ comes to pierce the darkness of sin and to bring life where there is death.

The "Elect" along with their sponsors, come before the celebrant and the assembly, who pray for them silently with a series of intercessions. It culminates in a prayer of cleansing and protection (exorcism) with the laying-on-of-hands. Each Scrutiny is a step in preparing the Elect for the celebration and initiation soon to come.

The Scrutinies are God's way of taking a close, loving look at the Elect. God does not scrutinize the Catechumens in order to find what is wrong with them but to celebrate all that's beautiful, good, and true in them. Jesus "scrutinizes" us with Divine Light, revealing all that is valuable within each of us. He also reveals to us the ways in which we are hurting, or sick, or sinful. This is not to reject us, but to call us to new life and to healing.

May these Scrutinies call both our Elect and us into the living waters of baptism, to the light of holiness, to a new life in Christ, through His Resurrection.

Please pray for Joshua, JoJo and Rhonda, that they may grow in faith and understanding during this special time in their formation.



We might default to thinking it's always the other way around. That faithfulness leads us to stewardship. Abraham radically obeyed God's command in being ready to kill his beloved son as a sacrifice. How? Maybe it helped that Abraham fully appreciated that Isaac came from God to Sarah and him as a pure gift in their very old age. This highlights the powerful connection between stewardship and faith. Once we appreciate as Christian stewards that every moment of our life and everyone that we love are pure gift from God, we can be radically obedient in our faithful generosity – freely letting more of God's generosity pour through us as he leads us and blesses us.



We would like to thank Louis Myers for sponsoring our CCD Breakfast last week. May God continue to shower His blessings to you and your family! Cannibals eat dead human flesh. What we receive in Holy Communion, in contrast, is fully alive. It is the glorified Body of the Risen Christ. Jesus' resurrected Body is a completely transformed "spiritual body" (1 Corinthians 15:44). It is different from our ordinary human bodies, which are confined by time and space. The Body of the resurrected Jesus, for example, could pass through walls, appear in different ways, suddenly appear, and suddenly disappear. In the Eucharist, the Risen Body of Christ is present sacramentally under the appearance of bread and wine.
