A Message from Fr. Pat.....

2024 National Eucharistic Congress,

Is taking place July 17–21 in Indianapolis, Indiana and is expected to draw and host more than 50,000 Catholics for Masses, worship, talks, workshops, and more to celebrate Christ's true presence in the Eucharist.

The congress, the first such event to be held in the U.S. in over 80 years, and is the culmination of a multiyear <u>"Eucharistic Revival"</u> initiative of the U.S. Catholic bishops, which aims to inspire deeper belief in and devotion to the holy Eucharist, the body and blood of Jesus.

What is the National Eucharistic Congress?

The National Eucharistic Congress is part of a three-year Catholic movement to revive the sacred tradition of the Eucharist and bring Catholics across the country together. The gathering is the first of its kind in 83 years after United States bishops voted to undergo a revival for the sacrament of communion.

As part of the revival, 50 bishops were deployed to preach across the country about the Eucharist and mass pilgrimages were organized to start from four corners of the country — Minnesota, Connecticut, San Francisco and Brownsville, Texas — with plans to converge in Indianapolis.

Marge and I are attending this event, and are very excited on going to the session we can attend over the time at the Congress. Keep an eye on the Historic St. Joseph Facebook page, we will be updating it with pictures from the congress.

What does the Church say about receiving Holy Communion standing or kneeling?

The Church allows the faithful to receive Holy Communion standing or kneeling, according to the norms established by the local bishops' conference. In the United States, the norm is that "Holy Communion is to be received standing unless an individual member of the faithful wishes to receive Communion while kneeling." A bow is the act of reverence made by those receiving.


