ST. JOSEPHINE BAKHITA

Feast Day : February 8

From slave to saint, St,. Josephine Bakhita was born in 1869 in Sudan where she was kidnapped at the age of 7, sold as a slave, mutilated and tortured. At the age of 14 she was sold to an Italian diplomat who took her to Italy where she was educated with her masters' daughter by the Canossian Sisters. She later stayed with the Sisters, received her sacraments and entered the convent.

Second Collection, November 23 and 24, 2024

November 2024 Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Our diocese will take up the national collection for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) on November 23/24. Your support for this collection brings change to communities across the country and empowers those living in poverty to transform their communities into reflections of the Kingdom of God.

Each year, the Office of Advocacy and Justice invests time meeting with local organizations in our diocese, seeking to build the kingdom of God through peace-building work. Unlike many of our efforts to help the poor and provide services to the needy, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development focuses on addressing the root causes of poverty and working to address social issues that affect the poor. The CCHD Collection has specific guidelines that require that organizations who seek funding do not take part in any work that is against Catholic Social Doctrine. Selected organizations must also show their plans to empower and give a voice to those most affected by poverty. This year, we have selected Floridians For Alternatives to the Death Penalty as our grantee. Floridians for Alternatives to the Death Penalty has been working with the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops to coordinate prayer vigils, educational events, and opportunities to advocate against the death penalty.

Your support for CCHD helps local community groups like the Floridians for Alternatives to the Death Penalty to build a culture of life. The Catholic Church teaches that all human life is sacred. Even people who may have committed terrible acts and caused great harm possess a human dignity instilled by God, our Creator.

I invite you to open your parish to learn more about the work of FADP and to pray and reflect on how you can support the work of the Catholic Campaign for Human Development through this collection. Through your prayers, participation, and contributions to CCHD, our Church continues her ministry to promote and strengthen the dignity of all human life.
