A Pastoral Advisory Council serves as a consultative body in a Catholic parish, offering advice to the pastor on matters related to the spiritual and temporal well-being of the parish community. It helps the pastor discern the needs of the parish and develop a pastoral plan to address those needs. Essentially, it's a group of parishioners who work with the pastor to guide the parish in its mission.

Here's a more detailed look at the functions of a pastoral council:

#### Gathering Parishioner Input:

Council members act as a bridge between the pastor and the parish, identifying the needs, concerns, and aspirations of the parishioners.

### Pastoral Planning:

The council reviews the effectiveness of existing programs and recommends adjustments or new initiatives to better serve the parish.

#### Consultation:

The pastor seeks the council's input on various pastoral matters, including spiritual, social, and temporal needs.

## • Promoting Unity and Collaboration:

The council fosters communication and collaboration among parishioners, encouraging active participation in parish life.

## Representing the Parish:

Members represent the diverse perspectives and needs of the entire parish community.

## Guiding the Pastor:

While the council advises, the pastor ultimately makes decisions, but they are in formed by the council's input.

Essentially, the pastoral council helps the pastor lead the parish by providing insights, facilitating communication, and contributing to the development of a vibrant and engaged Catholic community.
